Metropolitan Bowls Association

Bowls SA has now formed a Metropolitan Bowls Association (MBA) and this is guite a significant change as this group will now be running our pennant bowls competition. The first meeting of the MBA is on Sunday 15 January and clubs have been asked to bring along any issues they would like to raise about the current pennant season and to identify any future directions. The points that your Board have identified at this stage are listed below and we will be raising these at the inaugural meeting. I will keep you informed about the outcomes of the meeting.

Current Pennant Season

- The new structure for pennants does not reward minor premiers where there are finals in that division. A side that finishes on top at the end of the season deserves to be rewarded as well as the grand final winner.
- The new structure has disadvantaged Beaumont which played in Metro 1 in 2015/16 which was only 2 levels below Premier League. This season, without being

relegated, our side is now playing in Division 4 which is 4 rungs below Premier League. This has the potential to impact on our ability to attract new players and retain promising players.

 As a club, we are interested in ascertaining how beneficial the early start for Wednesday pennants has been.

Future Directions for Pennant Bowls

- The current format for the majority of sides is teams of four. Is it time to explore this format and propose different models that could be trialled? Our top side has teams of pairs, triples and fours on Wednesday and our bowlers find this format very engaging.
- We are really heartened to be informed that a meeting will be held in February to discuss the current women's competition and its future. Our club started a new women's team in 2014/15 with only one experienced player and the rest responding to our club's recruitment strategies. The future of women's bowls is of concern because we believe that this competition is essential.
- The financial viability of a number of clubs needs to be recognised as a serious issue to be considered in the decision making processes of the Metropolitan Bowls Association.
- What are the implications in staffing this new association under the umbrella of Bowls SA? Will we be adding another


layer of bureaucracy and maintaining the staffing level of Bowls SA?
