Your Board studied what a number of other clubs do and feel this will bring us more in line with local clubs. We will look forward to receiving your opinion.

Future Planning:

It is imperative as a Board and Club that we look ahead at our bowling needs and plan for a successful future. Some of these areas include selection, upskilling prospective skippers, coaching and bowler development, etc. The Bowling Operations Portfolio is giving this some serious thought at the moment and will be meeting with selectors and members over the coming months.
