## **Facilities Facelift**

The Burnside Council has reviewed and accepted our colour scheme for painting the exterior of our clubrooms and the scope of work is now out for tender. The work will be completed between Monday October 14 and Friday November 8 and it shouldn't



interfere with us at all given our bowling season would have started. The offer from the Council doesn't extend to our railings, shade supports and sheds, etc but we have asked the tenderers to provide a separate costing for us to consider so that all the work may possibly be done at the same time, which would be excellent. **Ian Campbell** and **Dave Thomas** have already painted our rink bins in charcoal.

This work doesn't include the Club's name on the building so we are going to get some quotes for this using vinyl lettering (cheaper) or acrylic (longer lasting). We are going to look years younger!

#### **Social Bowls**

Your Board discussed this and we are going to **trial running social bowls on a Thursday afternoon** to see how it goes. #### Air Conditioning

We have submitted an expression of interest into our local Federal member through the *Stronger Communities* program to replace the air conditioners in our hall. The quote we received from our wonderful sponsor **Humphrey's Electrical** was for a tad over \$20,000 and if our submission is successful, we will hopefully be granted half that amount. Fingers crossed that we get invited to send in a full submission which will be a good sign.

Just on our upgrade, we received a full quote from our designer **Stephen Henderson** that to totally complete the interior including the storage area for our tables, wall panelling, honour boards, painting, new trophy cabinet etc. will be around \$62,000. (this amount includes the air conditioning)

So we still have a little way to go but hopefully we will be able to complete the air conditioning (with the help of the grant) and the storage area very soon.

Our finances are looking good due to our very successful soup/curry nights and social bowls this year. We have very generous members.

## Night Owls

Night owls will be starting on Tuesday October 22 and we will be in touch shortly with our "regular" helpers to see if they are still ready to get involved but if you would like to join us and get involved we can always use new people to help out.
