Some Housekeeping Matters

Ian Campbell & I have now drafted new hiring contracts for our regular users of the hall/bar/lounge areas.

The regular hirers are Barbara Travis who holds bridge sessions & lessons on Monday afternoons, Tuesday mornings & afternoons and Friday all day. The Christadelphian Church group meet on Sunday mornings, Sunday evenings & Wednesday evenings. Probus Glen Osmond meet the first Monday morning of each month & Probus Burnside on the second Monday morning of the month.

Written into the new agreements are very clear instructions relating to furniture movement & replacement.
