Welcome to the big time Nobby – great to have you on board.

On & Around the Greens (Dennis Reid)

Commencing last Sunday James Gregory has started renovating our greens. He used a machine called an "Air2G2" which is used to penetrate up to 30cm below the surface and break up the layers of compacted soil. This was carried out on all 3 greens.

Next step will be to solid tine all greens and add new soil to the holes and given the right weather conditions there will be some light dustings spread over the surface. This work will carried out over the Xmas break.

This period is the only opportunity to do this type of work in order that we can get the greens up to a more suitable condition after the heavy rainfall from May onwards this year.

At all times over Christmas / New Year break there will be at least one green available to members. However please be aware the running speed will not be great. Slowly they will be brought back to speed for the start of pennants.

If rolling up over this period and if using the shades would you please remember to roll back the shades after using as we need the maximum sunlight on the banks and ends of the greens.

Drainage Works – "B" Green

As reported in the last newsletter, there is an urgent need to carry out some long overdue drainage works to the "B" green. The works will involve inserting a sump in the south eastern corner of the green including a submersible pump with connections from the Paint Store & the sump adjacent the locker room which will divert storm water from the steps in front of the main entrance doors. Further works will entail replacement of the current earthenware stormwater drain under the southern bank of "B" green with PVC. We have since engaged Northway Plumbing to undertake these works commencing 17th April 2023

New Shade Structures

Since the last newsletter, the Board & in particular Brian Purdie & Ian Campbell have been working feverishly to complete a comprehensive grant application to partially fund new shade structures to "B" & "C" greens. We approached 3 companies to provide costings for the work however only one, a company called Shadeform had the expertise to undertake the work. Together with some concrete cutting and remediation works by others, the total cost would be \$109,450 (plus GST). Our thoughts on funding for this scenario were (Grant - \$45,000, Council \$25,000 and BBC \$39,250.

A meeting was held with James Brennan (Burnside Council) to present to him our thoughts on the proposal & more importantly requesting funding assistance. I am pleased to report that the Council has since committed the \$25,000 towards the project.

We won't find out if our grant application is successful or not until March next year. If it is, the new shades could be in place by April. If the grant is not successful, the Board will need to investigate alternative funding arrangements.
