On & Around the Greens (Dennis Reid)

Since the last report and from the third week of December a lot has been happening to our greens.

Spraying for Couch Mite, 2 applications of liquid fertiliser and granular fertilizers and 2 applications of wetting agent with organic matter.

B and C greens were top dressed with 5 tonne of soil added after being punched with 8mm solid tines. A green was punched with solid tines and gypsum and magnesium added to all greens. Since post renovation work all greens have been scarified and groomed.


Plugs have been positioned in the bare areas to speed up the recovery. Interesting to note that during the plugging it was noticeable that the turf roots were starting to go deeper which is a result of the "Air2G2" being used in December. Also it appears that we are not getting as much pooling of water after watering times.

The most disappointing aspect has been the slowness with the spreading of runners which should have shown more significant growth. However we are now starting to see more improvement in the last week or so.

We will continue using A and C greens for pennants and will bring back B green as it shows improvement to the overall coverage.

Recent Theft

Unfortunately, at 2.15am on Friday 10th February the Club was visited by a low life character who had great delight in stealing all of the copper piping in the garden beds on the western side of B & C greens and copper pipe at the entrance of B & C green pedestrian gate.

The culprit has been caught on our security cameras, copies taken and submitted to Police on their instruction. Investigation into further upgrading our security system will now take place.

In the meantime, we are arranging for replacement works to be undertaken (a very expensive annoying process!!!)

New Shade Structures

As mentioned previously, a Grant application has been submitted to the Community Recreation and Sports Facilities Program for \$45,000 to install new shades on B & C greens and we are now waiting for a decision from them - expected late March.

Prior to this, Dave Thomas, Ian Campbell, Brian Purdie & Derrick Witt will visit Shadeform to discuss the intricate details of the new shades, expectations of what is required by BBC (i.e. removal of existing shades, cutting of concrete etc.) and cost confirmation.
