On & Around the Greens (Dennis Reid)

With the continuation of favourable weather James has been able to work on all greens without the heavy rainfall we had last season.

All greens have been scarified and fertilized and have been sprayed for black beetle and wetting agent. The colour and general coverage is well ahead of the same time in 2022.

This season James will be watering A green on Thursday night after the ladies pennants which will then be closed until Tuesday morning practice and general roll up time for all others.

This will ensure that this green will be dry for Tuesday practice and the Wednesday and Thursday pennant games. For Wednesday and Thursday, pennant games we will be across the three greens.

Saturday games will played on B and C greens.

Watering for B and C greens will be on Sunday nights as has been the general pattern in past seasons.

Sundry Working Bees

You will have noticed some new concrete paving in front of the clubhouse adjacent the paint store. Being a high traffic area, we have always had trouble growing grass so a decision was taken to concrete the area.

A big thank you to James Gregory who cut out the old turf and transplanted that to the bare area in front of the machinery shed. Thank you also to Robert Keage & Ian Campbell for helping to remove excess soil and to Angelo who placed reinforcing fabric & assisted the concrete finisher with the finished product.

We now have a considerable amount of soil, concrete & sundry rubbish accumulated in the Hay Street driveway. We have arranged for a contractor to come and remove this in early November.



Concertina Doors

After forwarding photos of our current concertina doors which badly need replacing, Ian Campbell spoke to a folding doors rep who felt we should be either looking at Timberline doors (similar to the current ones) or Acoustic, which have a slightly larger fold and with more soundproofing. Quotes were received for both - Timberline \$5,665 (not including installation) and Acoustic \$8,041 (not including installation). We would either have to install them ourselves which is a major undertaking or arrange for a contractor to install which would not be a cheap exercise. A couple of door suppliers in Adelaide have been contacted but do not handle concertina doors. Further investigations are being undertaken.

Pennant Bowls

The pennant season is underway with four games played thus far. Some interesting results, however the disturbing aspect for me is that we had to forfeit a Saturday & a Wednesday side in the first two games due to a lack of available players.

Prior to the start of the season we were confident we had sufficient numbers however for a variety of reasons that is now not the case. If we can't get players back there is a possibility we may have to pull one side or maybe two from the competition which is not ideal.
